

Dear *GTD* speakers,

We would like to invite you to submit a short paper based on your presentation to *Linguistics in the Netherlands* (LIN). The advantages of submitting to and publishing in the LIN series are:

- **Open access:** *LIN* publications become open-access two years after publication.
- **Journal status:** *LIN* is an official linguistic journal. It is peer reviewed and indexed in *Scopus*, *Linguistic Bibliography/Bibliographie Linguistique*, *LLBA*, *MLA Bibliography*, and *IBR/IBZ*.
- **Speed of publication:** *LIN* appears in the same year as the conference, no later than six months after notification of acceptance.
- **Review process:** all submitted papers are reviewed by two external reviewers, which means that all authors receive knowledgeable feedback (generally within two months after submission) and that the quality of the published papers is ensured.
- **Visibility:** papers in *LIN* volumes are downloaded frequently. In 2019, tables of contents of LIN volumes were viewed 7,000 times on IngentaConnect and John Benjamins e-Platform. Articles were found and abstracts viewed on those two platforms more than 65,000 times, resulting in ca. 4,500 full-text views. World-wide, over 60 libraries subscribe to **LIN**, including institutions such as the British Library, Harvard, and the Beijing University of Foreign Studies. Through the Benjamins sites, Google Scholar indexes the articles; *LIN* is also indexed in Scopus, and metadata provided for indexing in many other sources such as Glottolog, MLA Bibliography, LLBA, and the Linguistic Bibliography.

Aim and scope *Linguistics in the Netherlands*

Linguistics in the Netherlands (the ‘LIN-bundel’) is a series of annual publications, sponsored by the *Linguistics Association of the Netherlands* (*Algemene Vereniging voor Taalwetenschap*) and published by John Benjamins Publishing Company. Each LIN volume contains a carefully selected collection of papers presented at the annual meeting of the society and it represents research in different fields of linguistics.

Call for papers *Linguistics in the Netherlands*

Speakers who have presented at the *GTD* can submit a paper to the *Linguistics in the Netherlands* series. Papers will be reviewed by two external reviewers and will be accepted only if the required revisions are minor. The editors also reserve the right to reject resubmitted papers if, in their view, the revisions have not been adequately made.

The Linguistics Association of the Netherlands (AVT) holds the copyright of all papers published in the LIN-bundel. This means that these papers cannot be published elsewhere without prior permission of the AVT (this also holds for translated versions).

Instructions for authors and schedule

1. The deadline for submission is Friday **April 3, 2020**. Anonymized papers should be sent to linbundel@gmail.com, in both MS Word and pdf, with contact details of the authors (name, affiliation, address for correspondence, phone number and e-mail address) in the body of the message.

For the publisher's guidelines, see <https://benjamins.com/catalog/avt/guidelines>. If you have any queries, feel free to contact the editors. Submissions should have a **maximum of 4500 words (including tables, endnotes, references, etc.)**.

It is crucial that authors adhere closely to the guidelines provided by Benjamins. Not following the guidelines could lead to rejection of a paper!

2. The editors will send the reviewers' reports to the authors in the week of May 11, 2020 along with their decision ('accept'/'accept with minor revisions'/'reject').
3. The final version of the paper must be sent to the editors no later than June 1, 2020.
