**Global Transformations and Governance Challenges (GTGC) Conference 2022**

**Leiden University | 8-10 June 2022**

**Deadline for submissions: 22 April 2022**

How are major world-scale changes in contemporary society governed? How might global matters such as geopolitical shifts, ecological changes, technological innovations, and pandemics be better governed? These questions lie at the heart of the [Global Transformations and Governance Challenges \(GTGC\)](#) programme at Leiden University, launched in 2020.

GTGC will hold its **first international conference on 8-10 June 2022** in The Hague. The proceedings will include high-level roundtables regarding the International Criminal Court (including opening remarks by the ICC President), climate change, and the global Internet in a divided world. Further conference panels will address questions of global peace and security, global migration, global health, and global human rights. Receptions and lunches will offer additional networking opportunities.

- name(s), affiliation, and a short biography (50-100 words) of the applicant(s)
- paper abstract of maximum 200 words
- panel description of max. 350 words and abstracts for each paper of max. 200 words
