Did you know that art and science go hand in hand? Art and science can complement, challenge and inspire each other. At Leiden University, we encourage combining these two disciplines. Via the Academy of Creative and Performing Arts (ACPA), an institute within the Faculty of Humanities, you have several options to combine your academic study with electives in the fields of visual arts, design or music. You can follow these courses at the Royal Conservatoire, the Royal Academy of Art or at Leiden University. In addition, ACPA is an institute devoted to artistic research. With ACPA you no longer have to choose!



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Extra challenges to personalise your studies

Are you looking for an extra challenge in your studies? Do you have a passion for visual art, music or design? You can enrich and deepen your studies at Leiden University with ACPA's unique electives.

Electives

With ACPA's elective courses, you approach art from a scientific perspective. These courses were developed by teachers from the Royal Conservatoire, the Royal Academy of Art and Leiden University. For more information, see page 4.

Conservatoire and Art Academy electives

As a Leiden University student, you can also take elective courses at the Royal Conservatoire and the Royal Academy of Art in The Hague. These are regular courses from the curriculum of both institutes that Leiden students can take. For more information, see page 4.

Minor

You can earn your elective credits by taking a minor, a cohesive set of courses worth 30 EC. ACPA has two minors: Music Studies and Creative Strategies for a Society in Change. All students from Leiden University can register. For more information see page 4.

Music and visual arts programme

ACPA has two programmes for motivated and talented students: Practicum Musicae, a music programme at the Royal Conservatoire, and Practicum Artium, a visual arts programme at the Royal Academy of Art. These programmes are easy to combine with your timetable at Leiden University and offer you the opportunity to develop your talent to a high level. An admission procedure applies to both programmes. Elective credits: you choose!

If you love art but want to look further than museums, concert halls or theatres, the ACPA electives will get you looking at music or art from an academic perspective.

Electives

The electives cover the different disciplines in art and music. Courses such as Music Cognition, Music – Philosophy – Politics, Music x Technology, Introduction to Jazz History and Popular and Global Music link music to philosophy, psychology, rhetoric and even Artificial Intelligence. If you are more into visual arts and design, in The Essay Film in Theory and Practice you'll research how filmmakers use the essay film to highlight social problems and will watch relevant essay films in Filmhuis Den Haag. Hacking Tools as Artistic Research is all about exploring the different sorts of interaction that are possible with everyday digital or physical tools. In the Art of Logistics, you'll study logistics processes and how logistics codes are made and how they are manifested in our everyday life. Exhibition Research Lab examines the possibilities of the exhibition as a framework for research, experiment and (re) presentation.

Our electives are taught by musicians, artists, lecturers and professors from the Netherlands and abroad: lecturers who have earned their spurs in scientific and artistic practice. The courses are taught in English and are open to all bachelor's, master's and pre-master's students from Leiden University. There are no additional costs.

Minors

Minor in Music Studies

In the Music Studies minor you learn to think about music in a different way. Music is more than just an art form, more than entertainment. What are the different roles of music within our society? How does today's society influence music? And vice versa: how does music influence politics, media and technology, for instance? In the Music Studies minor, theory and practice come together.

Minor in Creative Strategies for a Society in Change

This minor makes a connection between gaining insight into creative processes and exploring social issues that characterize our time. The perspective is that of the visual arts disciplines, including film and design. The thematic emphasis is on broad social developments and urgencies that involve a multitude of topics, such as migration, climate change, decolonial and anti-racist struggles, to name a few.

'I have the feeling it is not well known among students, but Leiden University offers a really nice possibility to take joint courses from the art school KABK in the Hague. Photography, music, visual arts, graphic design: there are several options. It is a good opportunity for students that don't study art, but want to explore their hobbies or maybe even future studies. In the second year of my bachelors Urban Studies I decided to take two electives in Photography at KABK. I really appreciated this opportunity. I always liked Photography and now I could develop my hobby in a more structured way.'

Lotje Dalmijn is a third-year art history student at Leiden University who is also following the Practicum Musicae music programme.

'I play classical percussion, mainly the timpani and marimba. Practicum Musicae (PM) has given me the chance to carry on with and grow in music alongside my studies. With percussion it is particularly hard to find a music school where you can take private lessons at an advanced level alongside your studies. With this programme it's easy to combine the two, so I can plan the lessons around my BA in art history. You plan each lesson individually with your teacher and the theory lessons are taught at different times, also in the evening. This means there's always a suitable time to attend the classes.

For me PM makes a nice change from my regular studies. As a humanities student you have your nose in books a lot of the time. This means I can do something else for a bit, and play music at an advanced level. I really like this combination. PM students give a monthly concert in Lokhorstkerk in Leiden and a Christmas and Summer concert. It's a fun way to keep in touch with other students and hear what they're up to.'

Visual arts programme: Practicum Artium


If you want to be involved in visual arts alongside your academic studies, you can follow the Practicum Artium visual arts programme. You will spend a year taking lessons in either one of the following courses: Drawing Dimensions, Painting in Practice and Context: Crafting Meaning with Colour, Photography: Visual Conversations or Graphic Design: Conducting Narratives at the Royal Academy of Art in The Hague. This is a unique opportunity for your further artistic development. And you will discover how you can link these artistic skills to your academic studies. In class, we give each other feedback and you notice how people look at art from their own backgrounds. Medicine students, for instance, often focus on the anatomical proportions of a drawn or painted person, while art academy students encourage you to be freer and to come out of your academic shell. Thanks to the mix of students from home and abroad and from different disciplines, you learn to put yourself in someone else's shoes. It gives a different dynamic that gives you lots of inspiration.'

Practicum Musicae

Do you play a musical instrument or sing at a high level? Have you wondered whether you should go to a conservatoire? Practicum Musicae might be just what you're looking for. Through ACPA you can combine your academic studies with a music programme at the Royal Conservatoire The Hague.

Music Programme: Practicum Musicae

If you are offered a place on Practicum Musicae, you will follow a threeyear talent programme at the Royal Conservatoire The Hague. You can specialise in Classical Music, Jazz, Vocals, Early Music, Sonology or Composition. You and your lecturer decide on your timetable, making it a unique way to combine your academic studies with your studies at the Royal Conservatoire. The programme consists of individual singing or instrumental lessons, music-theory lessons and ensemble coaching. You form a close-knit community with the other students on the programme, have plenty of opportunity to play with other musicians and are taught by renowned musicians from the Netherlands and abroad.
