Develop your language skills

A key focus of this programme is on language training and developing your fluency in an East Asian language. We have experts in language training who are skilled in facilitating this learning process and about one-third of the programme consists of advanced language classes in modern and/or classical Chinese, Japanese or Korean. You will be expected to apply your language skills when writing your MA thesis by using primary materials written in Chinese, Japanese or Korean.
