**“The Blue Dot: a Post-Representational Reading of Google Maps”
with Joost Grootens via Kaltura Live Rooms**

In his 2020 PhD research 'Blind Maps and Blue Dots', ACPA assistant professor Joost Grootens investigated the blurring of the producer-user divide in contemporary mapmaking practices of technology companies and amateurs. In this lecture Grootens will focus on Google Maps, the world's most used map, and connect different modes of cartographic thinking to how Google Maps looks and functions as a graphic product.
