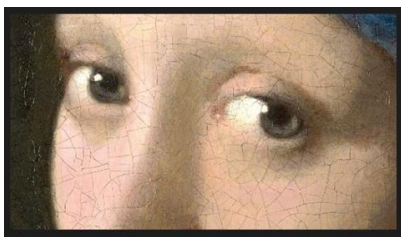


Image: Detail of Vermeer's

What did the Girl with a Pearl Earring look like when Vermeer finished it in 1665? Paintings change over time, but with the latest techniques the Mauritshuis has been able to reconstruct what the Girl must have looked like. Liselore Tissen conducted research into the changing perception of the work and which technology can best and most authentically represent the findings. » See the [publication of the research here](#). Opening on June 8, the results of this research are shared during an exhibition in the foyer where a 4 x 5 meter, 3D printed reproduction of the Girl will be displayed and can be touched.
