Study abroad

Why?

One of the main aspects of the BA International Studies is the specialisation in a certain area in the world, in its culture, politics, history and economics. However, in order to truly understand an area, one must experience it up close. This is exactly what a semester abroad offers: the chance to be a student at a different university in a different country for four to five months; learning and taking courses in a different education system, while deepening one’s knowledge and understanding of the area.

Nothing develops self-awareness more than being immersed into another culture, living in a different country, and getting to know and interacting with people there. A semester abroad offers all this and more to students as they meet new people and make bonds and friendships across the globe.





What and when?

Students can apply to study abroad at a partner university as exchange students for one semester, in the first semester of the third year. Those students selected for exchange remain registered in their BA International Studies programme at Leiden University, and pay their regular tuition to Leiden, while studying at the partner university. So exchange students do not pay tuition to their host university. Students, are however, responsible for associated costs, such as travel, insurance, housing, and food, just as they would be in the Netherlands.

Who can go on exchange?

Any International Studies student has the option of applying to study abroad, provided they pass all their first year courses, and maintain a minimum GPA of 7.0. Some individual universities will have their own specific requirements, which can be discussed with the Study Abroad Coordinator.

Places at partner universities are limited, so eligible students go through a selection process. The Study Abroad Coordinator will support you in finding a place at the most suitable and exciting university.

Where can students go?

There are three groups of partner universities that International Studies students can choose from:

- International Studies’ partner universities,
- University-wide partners,
- Faculty partners.

Lastly there is the possibility of “free moving”: a separate framework through which you can study abroad at a university which is not an official partner in the previously mentioned groups of universities. Different conditions apply to “free moving” (e.g. on grade averages and tuition fees).
