

FAQ's online advanced summer programme

1 What does the programme look like?,

The programme is spread over three days and led by one of our programme leaders. The programme provides lectures and interactive break-out sessions to engage with fellow participants and experts.

2 How do I participate?

After you have registered and you received a message from us that you have been admitted to the programme, you will receive a payment link through which the programme fee can be completed. Please note that you will only be secured of a place in the Summer Programme once we have received the tuition fee in full.

3 Is there a discount fee? Or a scholarship?

No discount fee or scholarship is provided for our online summer programme.

4 Will I obtain a certificate or diploma?

A certificate will be provided on completion of the course.

5 Are there quizzes or exams?

No formal quizzes or examinations will be part of the programme. Questions will feature in interactive break-out sessions, to be discussed with fellow participants and lecturers.

6 Does the course qualify for CPE's?

No the course does not qualify for CPE's.

7 Do I need to have a certain level or experience to attend?

A basic knowledge of counter-terrorism is welcomed, as our programme is generally aimed at mid-level career. The programme is meant for international as well as Dutch professionals that already work in the field of preventing violent extremism.

8 How is the programme structured? Lectures, discussion based?

9 How can I pay the costs?

After registration you will receive an email with a payment link from us. The payment can be done by mastercard, visa, ideal and paypal.

10 How is the programme different from the MOOC?

The programme differs from the MOOC in the way that it allows interaction with lecturers and fellow participants. Our programme also covers aspects of counter-terrorism and violent extremism that are not included in the MOOC, for example lectures on how and why people join violent extremist movements and the role of narratives and social media. Only parts of the introduction on the first day might have some overlap with contents of the MOOC.

11 How many people will participate?

Between 20-50 participants are expected to participate. We see to it that the amount of participants and the structure of the programme will allow sufficient interaction between lecturers and participants.

12 What time will lectures go on?

The programme starts each day at 12:30 CEST and ends at 16:00 CEST.

13 Is it European time based ?

We will follow CEST (Central European Summer Time) / UTC+2 time. Our time schedule is set to accommodate our participants the best we can, who are located in various time zones across the world. We acknowledge that for some this schedule would still entail an early start or ending late in the evening. We hope that you will understand this choice, as it enables us to welcome a more diverse and international group of participants to our online programme.

14 Will you provide additional materials?

Additional reading material will be provided by our lecturers, but they are not obligatory. Conference video clips will not be provided, as lectures and discussions will be live-streamed.
