Content of the Programme

Violence can create fear and insecurity and may undermine social trust, democratic institutions and the rule of law. In the specialisation Violence, Interventions, and Policing, students are familiarised with the many forms of interpersonal violence, including violence related to crime, gender-based violence, and violence occurring in contexts of public disorder. The programme provides the analytical tools needed to understand how violence emerges, whom it affects, and how it can be prevented or mitigated.

The track places specific emphasis on the role of policing and other security actors. Students examine the legitimacy, effectiveness and consequences of interventions and the use of force, as well as the social, organisational and political contexts in which policing takes place. Attention is also given to prevention strategies and intervention programmes, and to why some responses to violence succeed while others fail.

In four specialised courses, students study the origins, dynamics and social contexts of violence alongside interventions and policing practices. Research skills form a core component of each course, enabling students to critically assess academic research, analyse empirical data and contribute to evidence-based approaches aimed at reducing violent harm in society.
