Major Requirements 2018-2019

- Successful completion of 85 ECTS within the major. This includes:
 - 15 ECTs at 100 level ('Birth of the Modern World', 'What is Culture?' and 'Social Theory in Everyday Life').
 - 15 ECTs methods courses, including 'Research Design' (compulsory)
 - 20 ECTs at 300 level
 - 10 ECTs Capstone

<u>IMPORTANT - Please note</u>:

- 'Research Design' is compulsory only for students who enrol in 2018 or later.
- HD students who have completed 'Urban Studies' and/or 'Paradoxes of Citizenship' in the academic year 2017-18 or before, can use these credits for the completion of their major.
- Content-wise, the course 'Anthropology of Difference' is the same as the 2017-18 course 'Approaches to Diversity: Anthropology.'
