

Minor Violence Studies

Study violence from very diverse scientific perspectives

In this minor programme you will study the origins, correlates, mechanisms, social contexts, and resilience after experiencing violence. You will delve deeper into the ways in which we can both prevent as well as respond to acts of violence. Urban riots, violent responses by police, drug-related assassinations, child abuse, bar fights: violence is a core theme in today's modern society. This minor will focus on interpersonal violence (i.e. violence taking place between individuals), the most common types including physical violence and sexual violence.

What will you learn?

In this minor programme, you will become familiar with the nature and scope of violence; the ways in which it impacts public order, and the ways in which society can respond to and, ultimately, prevent violence. Furthermore, the programme contains courses that address specific forms of violence, ranging from domestic violence (child abuse and neglect, intimate partner violence), lethal violence (drug-related homicide and firearm-related homicide), and the impact of violence on individuals, communities, and society at large. Using criminological, sociological, historical, public health, neurobiological psychological perspectives, this minor programme provides you with an indepth understanding on this multifaceted phenomenon.




For whom is this minor?
