**OPEN SEA Summer School**  
**on Migration, Sea Border Control and Human Rights**

With the large-scale arrival of migrants and refugees to the European Union, Member States face an increasing number of challenges. According to the International Organization for Migration, the number of fatalities of migrants and refugees in the Mediterranean in January 2016 topped 360 due to a particularly deadly final weekend of the month, when over 100 men, women and children died in the waters off Greece, Turkey and Italy.

Irregular migration by sea, however, is a complex phenomenon which is not destined to stop at any time soon and the absence of timely, reliable, and publicly trusted measures is a fundamental issue to be urgently resolved in order to ensure both border control and the protection of migrants' lives and human rights.

With the Open Sea Summer School, the Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence on Migrants' Rights in the Mediterranean intends to engage in dialogue and exchange with academics and stakeholders. Without such innovative approaches, basic questions regarding changes in immigration flows and the effectiveness of policies and programs cannot be authoritatively answered.
