
## Jornt Mos: Portfolio Management at Novartis (Basel, Switzerland)

As a Portfolio Management trainee at Novartis, I am working in a big team of Technical Project Leaders, Global Resource Managers, a Global Project Office Manager and two Global Heads Portfolio Management. Together we are responsible for leading and managing the innovative projects in the Biologics portfolio of the company. Our portfolio covers all 'late-phase development' biologic projects meaning from the moment a project enters the clinical trial phases until product launch and post-launch operations. Some of my main responsibilities during the internship are managing financial resources, tracking and communicating project development, giving support to one of our technical development teams and setting-up and developing a Portfolio database that includes visualizations of project data. During the internship I am based in Basel, Switzerland at the city-like campus and headquarters of Novartis. Through my work I get to experience



and learn first-hand how fundamental research and business are co-dependent and equally important for a company like Novartis. As a global leader in the industry, Novartis focusses on science-based innovation and new business approaches to revolutionize healthcare and expand access to medicines for patients.

This is how I eventually was able to choose between a Marketing internship with Bayer in Dubai, UAE, or a Portfolio Management internship with Novartis in Basel.
