- b. A Bachelor's degree (or an equivalent degree) in Psychology from a research university that provides knowledge, skills, and understanding equivalent to those acquired in the Leiden University Bachelor's programme in Psychology¹.

 4. ANOVA (one-way and two-way designs) and ANCOVA
 5. Repeated measures ANOVA and MANOVA
 6. Logistic regression
 7. Mediation analysis
 8. Psychometric knowledge and techniques (e.g. reliability, validity, and item analysis of psychological tests)
- Skills in the use of statistical software
- Knowledge of research methods, including theoretical concepts in research methodology, research ethics, and practical training in research skills
