- In The Netherlands, we work with the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS). If your university uses another credit system you can make a conversion of your local credits to ECTS credits by using the following calculation:
 - 1 credits = [(programme duration in years*60)/total credits required to graduate] ECTS
 - Example: programme duration: 4 years, total credits required to graduate: 480 credits. $(4*60)/480 = 0.5$. Therefore, 1 credit = 0.5 ECTS.
